Sports Galore

This half term we put forward a team for the netball competition. They played extremely well and represented our school with super sportsmanship and excellent behaviour. Da iawn pawb! More sporting events next term to look forward to. Include more netball and football tournaments.



The majority of our pupils come to school in uniform which they wear with pride. Here are a few things to remember. We have a strict **NO Jewellery policy** which includes earrings. I understand at the end of the year that the children might have outgrown their school shoes but in September all children must be in black shoes or black trainers without coloured logos. This is the same for leggings/shorts worn to school.

Everything must be plain without logos. We have boxes of preloved uniform so if anyone needs anything then please get in touch.

We have to be very flexible and fit around our staffing constraints here at Deri so the children need to bring a PE kit everyday. Better still, the children can bring their kit in at the beginning of the week and leave it in school until Friday or bring it in at the beginning of a term and take it home at half term/the end of term. If it is dry we will be going outside and so they need trainers and warm joggers/jumpers. If it is wet then we will do PE in the hall.

School Uniform

A school is often judged by the appearance of its pupils and a smart standard of dress helps create a positive image and a sense of belonging. It is with this in mind that we encourage children to wear our distinctive school uniform.

The school colours are royal blue, grey, black and white. White polo shirts and royal blue sweaters/cardigans with the school logo can be bought from most big supermarkets. If you would like to purchase the logoed polo shirts and jumpers/cardigans then you can get these from CC Sport or Ruggerbug.

General

- Royal blue sweatshirts/cardigans
- White polo shirt
- Black/grey trousers/skirt/pinafore (no jogging bottoms/jeggings/denim trousers)

P.E.

- Royal blue/black shorts/tracksuit bottoms
- White T-shirt or a coloured t-shirt in your child's house colours with logo from CC sports/Ruggerbug
- Trainers



Low-heeled sensible black shoes are essential as children's feet are still developing and can so easily be damaged by fashion shoes. We would ask for the wearing of trainers to be restricted to out-door games sessions. But if trainers are worn for school uniform please ensure they are all black. The school has a strict 'no jewellery' policy. Children who can tell the time may wear a watch.
